Proposal: Messaging guidelines for legal and media teams over policing

- 1. Police are deployed against political movements to defend business as usual, we oppose business as usual, and therefore there will always be conflict between the climate camp and the police.
- 2. There is a long history of violent opposition to social and environmental progress, just look at the violence metered out to the US civil rights movement and the suffragettes by the police. Today's violence by the police including against climate justice activists is merely more of the same.
- 3. Only a large social movement with many allies can tackle climate change/ We need to be very careful with our communications as we have a limited ability to affect how newspapers, politicians and others represent our movement and its activities. CONSENSUS

2. Political Developments and Context

Ed Miliband CCS Statement Summary

- UK needs CCS
- Will allow new coal fired power stations
- New stations need to capture and store at least 25% of their C02 emissions
- Must be at 100% by 2025
- Must be economically viable to have CCS
- 1-4 demonstration plants
- Doesn't apply to existing coal power stations (eg. Drax)
- Pre combustion technology up to 90% emissions
- Post combustion = capturing emissions after its been burnt
- Post combustion can be retro fitted to existing plants
- 4 new plants are getting funding from government
- 2 in the pipe line
- 2010 look at applications for new plants
- Trouble finding funding some from government, some from EU, some from billing customers.

- China is already investing in it, not true that UK needs to lead the way
- Likely to be in Thames estuary area in clusters Kingsnorth, Tilbury. Also near Edinburgh.

Would help to know Space working group update. £12,000 has been raised to fund a space in Kent for outreach, awareness raising, a launch pad for people to take action from.

3. Feedback from Brighton gathering

Theme for Camp: feedback from Brighton minutes

- Gamble/Casino theme had been discussed, some support and some concerns
- Affinity group and training emphasis for the Camp

Comments:

- Would need to be done carefully, some concern about spending energy defending from the police
- Too much effort to work visually, over ambitious, distinction underpinning two narratives
- Casino issues not just about markets, needs to address consumption, too limiting
- Camp needs to be positive and give show vision of positive alternatives
- Difference between theme and narrative, location of camp in past have been narrative, this year not so obvious. Media agenda moved on about financial system.
- Positive space needed for Camp
- Over-ambitious, needs to be positive, intellectually unsound, cause confusion

4. What workshops do we want at this year's Camp?

- With no mass action planned, workshops now main focus
- Previously 4 days, 200 workshops
- Organised by small collective and admin heavy task
- Session to review structure and themes for the Camp
- Since last year, questionnaire feedback suggested focus needed to be on practical stuff direct action, media, legal etc and that there needed to be themes to the workshop
- Action Support and Workshops Group need to work together
- Opportunity for on the job training given the swoop

- Working with new people with diverse views

- Workshops need to be focussed on the type of audience present
- DA training from basics onwards
- Creative methods for learning (Think Club NEF)
- Financial, Copenhagen, Creative side, DA training: share responsibility for themes
- Earth First: week before, same approach make contact?
- Funding for marquees may only have one, use Neighbourhood marques
- Communication between Site and Workshops
- Copenhagen probably will not work, Camp needs to be developed in that context
- Need to ask what people want the workshops to cover and who they would like as invited speakers
- Workshops need to link to economic system as that is why we are in London
- Need to have focus on this theme otherwise will end up with workshops on everything
- Communication with Scotland and Wales
- More practical and training, strategising and movement thinking than information –

temperature check supports

- DA training more than just action, include legal and media
- Self-organised meetings could be accommodated in a space
- Local areas structure need to come out of the Camp with that strengthened
- Workshop Group come back on Sunday with a proposal
- Put up paper over rest of Gathering to gather ideas
- Add to website
- Need act quickly to sign up some people
- Already agreed financial/Copenhagen focus, need also to build movement
- Need steps to Copenhagen so first step available to new comers

6. Political policing and the movement - a discussion

Introduction – How things have changed since this has become an issue in the media.

Legal team has been working hard on this.

Four different perspectives on the issues:

1. Change in the movement

After G20 we didn't get much coverage – more to do with banks being smashed up etc. *but* more attention after the causes of Ian Tomlinson's death became clear. What we've been aware of for years got brought into the public sphere. Much more public sympathy to our 'this is not a riot' approach. Public image of being 'reasonable radicals' – no excuse to beat us up. They have better armour than us! Best example of this change was the media coverage of the ratcliffe-on-soar 114 arrests.

2. Legal team

[Remit: Legal team there to provide practical support – information, training legal observers, gathering evidence, campaigning on policing & legal issues, action arrest support.]

Environment has changed quickly recently. All information has been given to the media team- last

piece is Panorama, coming up. Look out for the Viz cartoon!

Have been focussing on the political and legal aspects – keeping the pressure on to prevent further reductions in the space for protest. Have to keep an eye on what government is doing. Legal team gave evidence to the Home Affairs Select Committee, provided a witness for them for their report.

Her Majesty's Inspectorate of the Constabulary (HMIC) were asked to investigate the G20 protest – this has prevented other inquiries taking place – is not independent itself although it claims to be, and doesn't include us. We have submitted our report but when should we 'storm out'? Met Police Authority has also set up sub-committee on 'civil liberties'.

Kingsnorth work still going on. "Improvement' report has been buried. Journalist working on this. Another review ongoing by South Yorkshire police – coming out in June along with interim report. In September, government white paper on police accountability.

Exploring potential to challenge police through Judicial Review. Bindmans solicitors has written a letter to the Met saying we're thinking we'll challenge and asking for their side. This got an amazing amount of publicity!

A time of opportunity for us – and for the police. Amazing public profile, lots of lessons learned especially with regard to the media.

Want a steer on HMIC; Judicial Review (to which we would have to contribute financially – some donations coming in*), and police wanting to be seen to engage in dialogue with climate camp.

*smallprint – money can be used otherwise if not needed.

3. Police liaison.

No advance police liaison at Drax – the first camp. Became obvious as a role in the process of the camp.

Heathrow – group with no negotiating role, underlining 'no leaders' and that would only give advice in line with the climate camp website. Also made a council liaison issue document – became a 'police and council liaison' working group. Making clear what we are doing and why (direct action etc.). Looking at police strategy documents etc., looking at the relationships between different forces.

Kingsnorth – strategy failed in terms of trying to engage with Kent. Team have copy of briefing document.

Facilitator – tensions between civil disobedience, challenging the police and the camp's political integrity ...

4. Process

There's a) the politics of what we're doing around policing and b) the tactics we choose to take on.

And implications of both of these things to wider publics.

- a. politics of the legal work we're doing are we assisting the police in facilitating protest on their terms? What control do we have over that process? Has become visible in view of G20 etc.. Concerns over division by media and police into peaceful and non-peaceful protestors related to vocabulary we use. London evaluation meeting re. Wider movement. Feeling that we allowed ourselves to be divided as climate camp from the wider movement.
- b. As community of activists, we tend to experience police violence once a year. Far more often for other communities. Need to correct the assumption that G20 policing was a one-off rather than ongoing.
- c. United campaign against police violence set up since the G20. We need to think about how we engage with them. Also 'defend peaceful protest' again, how do/ can we engage?
- d. Question of future liaison not just ongoing defence of civil liberties, but re. Actions we're undertaking this year. How sustainable are the 'separate' legal and liaison groups and links with the media.

Interlocking questions we need to think about.

Clarifications

- cc legal team can't speak on behalf of meltdown
- others aren't bound by cc decisions legal team are facilitating individuals in taking action.

Questions, points etc...

What is HMIC process?

Have offered to meet with us to discuss our role. We may storm out.

Judicial Review?

Court looks at police actions to decide whether or not they are lawful.

Section 1 blanket searching at Kingsnorth is being JR'd.

Kettling and use of force at the G20 – to be decided.

Legal team did not negotiate with police ahead of the G20

How closely is legal working with media team and is it working well?

Media team burnt out after G20 but do now have support.

What happens if litigant wins a JR on kettling?

Basically, publicity and might improve situation in time.

What about setting out what we expect from the police? Setting the rules of the game.

HMIC review are they expecting the legal team to speak on behalf of CC? What is the best way to delegitimise the police?

Contrast between police reaction to rape (they disappear) and protest (overkill).

All as comrades. Orientation towards assumption of police benevolence is problematic.

Need to think about how the movement appears. Movement behaviour in general. Need to welcome new people. Police and media as ruling class agencies. Need to underline this. Every time we 'play their game' this is relative to this understanding.

Tensions in the wider movement. Feeling of betrayal e.g. by post-G20 media coverage. We need to think about this and our messaging. Working groups need thought-through steering from the

whole camp. Maybe need to come up with broadly agreed key messages / agreed principles at a basic level.

Riot cops at protests never legitimate. E.g. not relevant whether they are wearing numbers. No dialogue! Need to identify police as part of the problem as much as burning carbon.

As a direct action movement, what we do involves being illegal. But/ and image is paramount, need to think about how we use current attention to achieve our aims.

How to decide about engagement. Premise is that policing is political and demystifying police's claim that they are reasonable, how about speaking to rank & file.

Media story about innocent protester and bad police. We are fitting in to this. Fact we were blockading a road got lost. Have to be careful about being dragged into this.

Legal team's role is about opening space to have better events and actions in the future. Also has to further the political aims of the climate camp. This may be contradictory, but/ and need to keep this in mind. Need to move away from media, police coverage.

Delineating 'the media' and indymedia.

HMIC, there to serve police, not public, and not us. Shouldn't touch this with a barge poll. Important to keep away from 'how should we be policed.'

Building a movement to stop climate change, all we do needs to be oriented towards this.

Re. engaging with the police, us to talk to them with the key concept of how can we fuck them over. Relationship with the police as a charade but maybe have to go along with this to show it as it is, we engaged in argument with the British public. Maybe show this in the workshops programme. Police have misunderstood what we were trying to do. Our responsibility to avoid confrontation? Be more tactical and take responsibility for confrontation more.

Tightrope between tactics and principles, climate camp too watered down. We aren't separate from black blocs ,Ķ people masking up at climate camp.

Impressed with our legal capacity. Legal defence is only one small aspect of what we do as a political movement. How do we relate to the wider movement?

Less disagreement than originally thought! Small group to meet parallel with working groups to come up with broad guidance for the media/ legal team.

June gathering

Need a neighbourhood to take on organising for 20/21 June. July, possibly Leeds. Need to think about August in view of Wales/ Scotland camps.

Amendment – Need to acknowledge other groups who fall victim to police violence now, not just in history...

'...including environmental campaigners...'

Specific examples of police violence indicates that should they improve their behaviour our relationship will be better, we need to be clear that we don't accept them at all.

Media team did discuss this at length, these are guidelines that represent the camp as widely as possibly.

The last one, doesn't help us if it gets into public domain, we come across as a group who wants to undermine the police which will

We understand that other groups get attacked by the police, it is recognised in those messages, but not positively actively acknowledged in there – we want to show solidarity clearly. We need something on the CC website that has a strong message about our solidarity.

Should that be a separate proposal for next gathering, or written as a proposal for later in the day for consensus.

There was a point that our tactics should be to delegitimise the police.

Police violence is mentioned, without the context of state repression, that statement should be in there explicitly.

'Demand a right to protect ourselves' should be in there.

This proposal is just for guideline for our own people, not public, doesn't need to be an essay.

Last one sounds childish, instead it should be... need to highlight the political role the police play in enforcing business as usual

That is guite like the first one.

Scrap the fourth one.

Business as usual because it causes climate change – is not the only reason we oppose business as usual, needs to be more anti capitalist.

3. What trouble to cause between now and Copenhagen?!

The camp – at last gathering we agreed not to have a mass action during the camp, but we didn't decide if affinity group actions would be included in the call out.

Review of April's minutes – Temperature checks – even split between the focus of the camp being on affinity group actions or preparing for autumn affinity actions.

Camp a base for decentralised actions, or for training and planning for post camp actions.

Not deciding what climate camp UK does at COP15 today, but what we'll do in the run up.

Two proposals;

- 1.To do a mass action in October against coal
- 2. To have a call out for loads of actions In between camp and COP15

Small group on Leeds - 30th Nov = 10th anniversary of Seattle, but not discussing that now.

Proposal 1

A series of events in the lead up to COP15, international working group proposes a hot autumn of discontent mobilising around Climate Justice Action

10th October, International Day to Defend Mother Earth (World Social Forum) and 24th October, 350.org day of action

The Copenhagen conference itself will have its own strategies outside of this remit.

Clarifying Q's

what is 350.org

350.org as in parts per million, organisations is based around that number to get it into public negotiations and public debate. The author who wrote first book on climate change, researched what the safest level of C02 parts per million which was 350. we are now way above that, need to reduce and go back. Mainly based in USA.

Defend mother earth action could be bio fuels

The two dates are the only two explicitly supported by Climate Justice Action

Is this proposal excluding actions during the camp? - NO

The dates that got support aren't the only dates that will get support – the 10th will and other.

Proposal 2.

The importance of mass actions to climate camp, not having one this year at the camp.

New coal will really screw the climate – needs attention.

Also COP15. UK could be exposed as hypocrites, want to present themselves as climate leaders, but undermining policies.

Need to challenge the status quo – we may have reached our top figure for people coming to actions. With a mass action called for by a diverse group – could attract loads more people.

Points

The Climate camp itself is a mass action

When? Dates suggested - 10-11th or 24-26th October

Where? There are 15 coal fired powered stations, main contenders are Drax and Ratcliffe on Soar How? Set a date and a meeting place, will need a lot of energy and organisation to be good, if we cant manage full capacity organisation then its not worth it.

Why is there only a couple of thousand people willing to take direct action? Might need to do lots of outreach, tours etc.

Concerns and problem

We have tried this before at Drax and Kingsnorth camps, didn't close anything down – can we pull off anything better than that?

If we're separating the actions might be more plausible. Doing action during camps takes a lot of energy.

Is it too focused on coal?

No it is a crucial pressure as gov are about to do a U turn on coal.

Will it be pigged?

Might be lots of people on bail – 114, climate camp etc. could be powerful if people are breaking bail etc.

Persistence pays off, if RTS had only done two wouldn't have been as successful as it was, need to try more than twice.

Not focused on the economics enough? – there is a G20 in October in St Andrews.

The way they are planning to develop coal can't be separated from the economic problems, big decentralised energy, business.

Only works if its a good idea, and if other groups are up for it.

Clarifying question:

Does the core group of organisers already exist to take this forward? Sort of/ no

What was the process for choosing Ratcliffe and Drax as two most likely? Owned by Eon or due to size and inefficiency

What number of key organisers are needed? Depends on the time commitment each person can commit, minimum four dedicated full-time plus 10-20 part-time. Requires full support of wider climate camp

What tactics will avoid preannouncement of action leading to failure? Numbers, stand-alone mass action is a new tactic for us.

Intention to shut down the power station or simply to blockade? Two options: symbolic blockade or spikier shut down, open to discussion.

Similar action in US Capitol Hill – uni competition to get numbers to action, only problem was the weather and still managed 5000.

Timeline for the action? Organisation must start from now, use camp to network and train – cannot start at the camp.

Must discuss aims for action – shut down or blockade and be realistic about what we achieve in communications post-action

Capitol Hill very symbolic – can we shut down a power station like that

Network with other groups very important – action group outside CC to plan the action? Who is organising this action CC or new coalition? Up for discussion

Clear onward direction from camp to Copenhagen, does this action fit within that?

Have you considered cost? Can't take from CC budget need to raise funds.

Small group discussion: two points

at the camp – use camp as spring board for action, call out for affinity group to take action at camps and after

SPECTRUM LINE ON CALLOUT FOR AUTONOMOUS ACTIONS AT CLIMATE CAMP more do not do a call out for autonomous actions during the camp than yes.

SPECTRUM TO USE EXISTING COAL MASS ACTION PROPOSAL

All but a hand few yes lets stick to original.

Temp check on the proposed coal action (spectrum line) = about 90% in favour 5% no and 5% not sure.

<u>Summary of the current coal action proposal:</u>

- 1: Climate Camp will organise a mass action targeting a coal fired power station.
- 2: It will be a weekend in October
- 3: It will be linked to the summer camp in London which will build through training and movement building, towards this action
- 4: A Working group will facilitate the action and decide on the weekend (potentially through a

coalition with other groups)

Do we need to decide the date now....?

Points were taken on these questions.

Including: practicalities relating to communications, working in coalition, the members of the coalition, and safety of the working group around the law.

Ammendments: were the inclusion of the words "coal fired" (which was probably a typing error) and the inclusion of the word "potentially"

Stand asides: I don't want it to clash with the action on the 12th October

CONSENSUS

Direct action at the Camp proposal:

In our publicity we state that we are calling for climate related autonomous actions with our camp as a spring board, (with spring board meaning offering training and for e.g. providing a list of potential targets).

Amendments:

Or say: one aim of this camp is to facilitate autonomous direct action.

Or: encourage people to preprepare actions

Or: add something about economics and the city

Current Proposal: That in our publicity we call out for autonomous direct action focusing on the city of London, the financial system and all those responsible for the economic and ecological crisis during the camp and the camp will facilitate it.

Stand asides: Total of 7, 5 minuted, 2 lost to computer malfunction.

- 1. How its phrased: the words "call out" and "facilitate" which may be too strong for the consensus. "There will be affinity group actions during the week" might be better.
- 2: Legal team will need to be bigger to support all this and our best way to get bigger is to run trainings during the camp and we can't do both
- 3: We want greater numbers and movement building and we don't want to dissuade people from coming and we don't want to take peoples' camp time away from the training.
- 4: Affinity actions will happen whether or not we do a call out. The problem with consensus on the wording which needs to be clear before we go for consensus.
- 5: "Facilitate" may be a legally problemactic word, in terms of responsibility.

Consensus not reached. Out of time. Networking Working group to come up with a better worded proposal.

Space was given a remit in which to work, which included raising its own money, it has done this but HAS to be at gatherings like all other working groups.

Action Support

Action Support needs more capacity if DA is the main theme for training at this year's camp. Join the working group. There is a skills training for trainers coming up.

7. Working group feedback

Media

A former informer from Drax 2006 has got in touch with the Guardian wanting to own up. The police identified him as a vulnerable person and squeezed him for information, not that any of it was much use.

The Gathering agreed that the Media Working Group will agree on the wording of a letter to be printed alongside the article which the Guardian will write saying that we understand that the police target vulnerable people and that we need to get on with taking action against the root causes of climate change.
